Start poor and slow. Won easily; second and third driving. Sir Barton, after beating the gate, indulged Natural Bridge with the lead over the Belmont course, then easily took the lead after entering the main course and, drawing away, was easing up at the end. Sweep On was saved under early restraint and made a vain challenge at the homestretch entrance, but tired near the end. Natural Bridge tired badly after pacemaking to the homestretch.
