Start good and slow. Won easily; second and third driving. Zev took the lead at once and, setting a good pace, held his opponents safe all the way, but was tiring in the last eighth and was shaken up near the finish. Chickvale was saved close up to the last turn, then gradually improved his position on the inside and finished fastest of all. Rialto began slowly, but closed an immense gap and passed Messenger in the last sixteenth. Messenger was a forward contender for a mile and a quarter, but tired badly in the stretch. Martingale was saved behind the leader in the early running, but tired badly when called on after going a mile. Hyperion, All American and Miss Smith were outclassed.
