Start good and slow. Won easily; second and third driving. Mad Play followed Sheridan closely for the first mile, then passed the latter into the lead, but was ridden out at the end to outfinish the fast-closing Mr. Mutt. The latter began slowly, but worked his way up steadily and, finishing with a rush, passed Modest and challenged the leader. Modest raced forwardly on the outside down the backstretch, moving up rapidly when called on, raced into third place when an eighth from the finish, but tired. Sheridan crossed in front of the others shortly after the start and set a good pace, but tired badly when Mad Play took the lead. Aga Khan was on the inside in the deepest going on the backstretch and tired badly. Beau Butler closed up some ground. Sun Pal and Klondyke had no mishaps. Abu Bell Ahdem showed some early speed. Samaritan always was outrun.
