Start good and slow. Won driving; second and third same. Pasteurized raced close to the pace from the start, moved up fast on the outside nearing the stretch, carried Dauber very wide and bumped him at the eighth post, then outlasted him in the final drive. Dauber, a trailer in the early running, moved up when settled in the backstretch, was then taken in hand again, was steered up on the outside and, carried very wide, hung in the final drive. Cravat saved much ground entering the stretch from a slow beginning, made a determined bid at the eighth post, but faltered under pressure at the end. Jolly Tar raced well from the start and had no mishap. Magic Hour showed speed under mild restraint, raced Gentle Savage into defeat and faltered. Gentle Savage had early speed, but was not persevered with when he quit.
