Peter Pan went out to make the pace and, going at a tremendous clip, was in front all the way, with the exception of an instant on the turn for home, where Frank Gill showed in front for a flash, but Mountain shook up Peter Pan and he came on again to win easily. Superman was reserved within striking distance, finished under a pull and could have won if his stablemate had been in any trouble. Frank Gill ran a grand race, but finally tired from chasing the winner. Hickory showed early speed, but failed to stay. Paumonok never was prominent. 2:15¾ was displayed as the time, but afterward taken down from having been taken from a wrong starting point.
