At the furlong pole Notter shook his whip at Colin and the colt came away quickly, but near the end he was eased up at the usual finishing post, Notter thinking the race was over, and this mistake almost cost him the race. Fair Play ran a wonderfully game race and stood a long stretch drive in the most resolute fashion imaginable. King James went well for a mile, but tired badly in the stretch. Robert Cooper always was badly outpaced.
