Start good and slow. Won easily; second and third driving. Pillory was taken back out of forward contention in the early running and saved to the stretch, then moved up with great speed on the outside of Snob II. and, after a mild drive, took the lead and was under restraint at the finish. Snob II. set a good pace under strong restraint in the early running, but tired badly when called on for a final effort and failed to stay the route. Hea raced gamely and came fast in the last quarter, but the leaders held him safe. Ray Jay ran well for a mile, but quit in the stretch.
