Start poor and slow. Won easily; second and third driving. Chance Shot set a good pace under slight restraint and drew away into a safe lead after entering the stretch, but was tiring at the end and was roused up sharply to withstand the rush of Bois de Rose. The latter showed speed and ran a good race from a slow beginning. He dwelt at the start and finished fast through the stretch. Flambino raced in closest pursuit from the start to the last quarter, then tired. Rip Rap moved up after rounding the far turn and finished gamely. Buddy Bauer tired badly in the stretch drive. Gold Coin tired and quit in the final half-mile.
