Start good and slow. Won easily; second and third same. Vito raced in close pursuit of the leaders to the last quarter, then moved up gamely while rounding the stretch turn and, passing the leaders when called on, was easing up at the end. Genie was saved close up under light restraint and came fast and gamely when called on, but was easily outfinished by the winner. Diavolo was badly outrun to the far turn and came wide when entering the stretch, but outfinished Broom Whisk in the final strides. The latter ran a good and game race and had no mishap. Victorian and Sun Beau raced lapped on each other and were much used, alternately making the pace and, failing to stay the route, tired badly.
