Start good and slow. Won easily; second and third same. Omaha was shuffled back after the break, recovered quickly and, allowed to settle in his stride, came to the outside of the leaders entering the stretch, finished fast and was drawing away at the end. Firethorn was rated along steadily, saved ground entering the stretch and finished well. Rosemont was forced wide rounding the first turn and dropped back. He moved up stoutly on the backstretch when called upon, but faltered badly in the stretch run. Cold Shoulder was rushed into command going to the first turn, was rated along steadily and had no mishap. Sir Beverley was not persevered with when he faltered.
