Winner—Br. c, by Man o' War—Brushup, by Sweep, trained by G. Conway; bred by Mr. S. D. Riddle.

Start good and slow. Won easily; second and third same. War Admiral, fractious at the post, began fast and, moving into command with a rush, was rated along steadily while saving ground and won with speed to spare. Sceneshifter raced forwardly from the start, was placed under severe pressure in the stretch, but was not good enough. Vamoose was restrained when outrun early, then moved up fast under urging in the stretch and held Brooklyn safe. The latter was outrun early, but moved up gamely on the far turn, only to tire, but came again near the end. Flying Scot broke well and raced under restraint the first part, was placed under pressure nearing the far turn, but could not menace the leaders and tired badly thereafter. Pompoon, sluggish in the early stages, failed to improve his position when called upon and tired. Melodist was outrun and never was a factor.
