Eighty-fifth running THE BELMONT. \$100,000 added. 3-year-olds. Colts and fillies ( geldings not eligible). By subscription of \$100 each, to accompany the nomination, starters to pay \$1,000 additional, with \$100,000 added, of which \$20,000 to second, \$10,000 to third and \$5,000 to fourth. Colts, 126 lbs., fillies, 121 lbs. Starters to be named through the entry box the day before the race, at the usual time of closing. (The winning owner will be presented with the August Belmont Memorial Cup, to be retained for one year, as well as a trophy for permanent possession.

Gross value \$118,600. Net value to winner \$82,500, second \$20,000, third \$10,000, fourth \$5,000. Mutual pool \$406,415.

Start good from stall gate. Won driving, second and third the same. NATIVE DANCER, a sharp factor from the start while in the clear, came to the outside to reach near even terms with JAMIE K. when straightened for the stretch run, forged to the front at the furlong marker and though displaying a slight tendency to shorten stride once in command, gamely withstood the latter. JAMIE K. raced closest to the early pacemaker during the run down the backstretch, went to the front on the final turn, gave way to the winner entering the stretch, then held on tenaciously easily besting the others. ROYAL BAY GEM, slow to gain best stride, moved up readily when shaken for the drive, but under stern pressure was not match for the top ones. RAM O' WAR, much used early, had little left. THE PREEM never was formidable. KAMEHAMEHA displayed brief speed and was unable to be persevered with during the late stages when his saddle slipped after he was hopelessly beaten.
