Start good. Won driving, second and third same. HIGH GUN, permitted to settle into best stride, was sent into closer contention on the final turn, responded readily when shaken for the stretch run and was alone in the concluding stride to outgame FISHERMAN. The latter, always within striking distance, forged to the front on the far turn, retained a clear lead at the furlong marker, but shortened stride while tiring during the late stages and was unable to withstand the winner, although easily best of the others. LIMELIGHT, sluggish leaving the gate, moved up menacingly on the inside nearing the furlong marker, but under brisk urging was unable to seriously endanger the leaders. PALM TREE, far back early, failed to make up appreciable ground when set down for the final test. CORRELATION raced forwardly while next to the inner rail.
