Start good. Won easily, second and third driving. GALLANT MAN, away alertly and saving ground to the mile, moved up steadily thereafter and disposing of BOLD RULER entering the stretch, drew out to win with speed in reserve. INSIDE TRACT lacked early foot, moved up boldly approaching the stretch, and, closing well under punishment, was unable to reach GALLANT MAN but easily best the others. BOLD RULER began fast, disposed of BOLD NERO after five-eighths mile and set the pace to the stretch but failed to stay when challenged by GALLANT MAN, then tired badly during the last eighth mile and could not hold INSIDE TRACT for the pace. POP CORN could not keep up. LUCKY DIP was never prominent and had no mishap. BOLD NERO engaged BOLD RULER to the mile, then gave way and was not persevered with after hopelessly beaten.
