By subscription of \$30 each. \$250 to pass entry box. \$1,000 to start. The added money and all fees to be divided 80% to the winner, 20% to second, 10% to third, 5% to fourth. Starters to be named through the entry box the day before the race by the usual time of closing.

CELTIC ASH saved ground while under restraint to the last three-eighths mile, was sent to the outside at the stretch turn, took command from VENETIAN WAY before reaching the furlong post and drew clear without need of urging. VENETIAN WAY raced nearest TOMPION for three-quarters mile, went to the front when sent to the inside and entered the stretch with a short lead but was unable to stay with CELTIC ASH. DISPERSE, racing on the outside to the stretch, held on willingly during the drive but was unable to overtake VENETIAN WAY. TOMPION took an early lead but was rank while setting the pace for three-quarters mile, then gave way to VENETIAN WAY but continued forwardly placed to the stretch before tiring. JOHN WILLIAM could not keep up. NAGEA, in close quarters leaving the upper turn, failed to rally when clear. TOOTH AND NAIL began alertly but failed to stay after racing forwardly placed to the mile.
