IN GATE AT 4.50. OFF AT 4.50 EASTERN DAYLIGHT TIME. Start good. Won easily.

CHATEAUGAY, well handled, saved ground while reserved early, bobbed slightly near the upper turn but recovered and, remaining on the inside for the stretch run, took command from CANDY SPOTS before reaching the furlong pole and drew clear without need of urging. CANDY SPOTS moved up fast after a half-mile and, disposing of BONJOUR, established a clear lead approaching the stretch but was unable to stay with CHATEAUGAY when set down in the drive. CHOKER, forwardly placed from the start, had no mishap in a sharp effort but was not good enough for the leaders. TOM CAT, in hand early, was unable to better his position when set down through the stretch. INSURRECTION, never dangerous, had no excuse. TOP GALLANT, never close, tired during the last half mile. BONJOUR went to the front early but gave way when challenged by CANDY SPOTS and was eased after hopelessly beaten.
