IN GATE AT 5.15. OFF AT 5.15½ EASTERN DAYLIGHT TIME. Start good. Won driving.

HAIL TO ALL, in hand until near the upper turn but always within striking distance of the leaders, moved to the outside approaching the stretch and, responding to strong handling while racing between horses through the final furlong, won from TOM ROLFE in the last strides. TOM ROLFE, reserved after beginning alertly, saved ground until the last three-eighths, reached the front between calls during the drive but was unable to withstand HAIL TO ALL. FIRST FAMILY engaged BOLD BIDDER and LA CIMA for three-quarters mile, took command near the upper turn and entered the stretch with a good lead, continued courageously but faltered when nearing the finish. DAPPER DAN, reserved until near the final turn, moved to the outside for the drive and, after making a bold challenge near midstretch, hung. LA CIMA, forwardly placed until near the stretch, had nothing left. SELARI, outrun early, was unable to reach serious contention. HAPPY GONDOLIER had no mishap. BOLD BIDDER went to the front at once and set the pace to the mile and gave way suddenly.
